Creation

- ⁶ By the word of the LORD the heavens were made,
And by the breath of His mouth all their host.
- ⁷ He gathers the waters of the sea together as a heap;
He lays up the deeps in storehouses.
- ⁸ Let all the earth fear the LORD; Let all the inhabitants
of the world stand in awe of Him.
- ⁹ For He spoke, and it was done; He commanded, and
it stood fast.
- ¹⁰ The LORD nullifies the counsel of the nations; He
frustrates the plans of the peoples.
- ¹¹ The counsel of the LORD stands forever, The plans of
His heart from generation to generation. (Psa 33:6-11)

Implications of creation

- The Creator is not the created.
 - Pantheism is false.
- Idolatry is a result of failing to recognize the Creator
 - Therefore consider the members of your earthly body as dead to immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed, which amounts to idolatry. (Col 3:5)

Implication of creation

- This is God's world. All things belong to him. He is its ruler. His power is absolute. We are in a steward relationship and dependent upon him and accountable to him.
- The world serves God's purpose.
- He will bring it to his desired end.

Implications of creation

- Who am I and how am I to live?
 - Created in God's image and the crown of his creation.
 - A piece of matter with greater development than other forms of matter.

Implications of creation

- Both men and women were made by God.
- All people are his “offspring” (Acts 17:28)
 - Some are not made out of better earth.
 - There is no master race.
 - None of the animals could meet man’s needs.
