




Teach the older men to be temperate, worthy of respect, self-controlled, and sound in faith, in love and in endurance.




love their husbands and children, 5 to be self-controlled and pure, to be busy at home, to be kind, and to be subject to their husbands, so that no one will malign the word of God.


Similarly, encourage the young men to be self-controlled. 7 In everything set them an example by doing what is good.

Part of Speech: Adjective


Definition: reverend, venerable, serious

hieroprepés: reverent

Original Word: ἱεροπρεπής, ἔς

Definition: reverent

Usage: suitable to a sacred character,
reverent.


diabolos: slanderous, accusing falsely

Original Word: διάβολος, ον

Definition: slanderous, accusing falsely

Usage: (adj. used often as a noun),
slanderous; with the article: the Slanderer
(par excellence), the Devil.

douloó: to enslave, bring under subjection

Original Word: δουλόω

Definition: to enslave, bring under subjection

Usage: I enslave.

kalodidaskalos: a teacher of good
Original Word: καλοδιδάσκαλος, ου, ὁ, ἡ
Definition: a teacher of good
Usage: a teacher of that which is noble
(honorable) and good


philandros: loving men, (of a wife) loving her husband

Original Word: φίλανδρος, ον

Definition: loving men, (of a wife) loving her husband

Usage: loving one's husband.

philoteknos: loving one's children

Original Word: φιλότεκνος, ον


Definition: loving one's children

sóphrón: of sound mind, self-controlled
Original Word: σώφρων, ον
Definition: of sound mind, self-controlled
Usage: of sound mind, self-controlled,
temperate, sober-minded, modest, chaste.


hagnos: free from ceremonial defilement, holy, sacred

Original Word: ἁγνός, ἡ, όν

Definition: free from ceremonial defilement, holy, sacred

Usage: (originally, in a condition prepared for worship), pure (either ethically, or ritually, ceremonially), chaste.


oikourgos: working at home

Original Word: οὐκουργός, οὔ, ὄ, ἡ

Definition: working at home

Usage: a keeper-at-home, a housekeeper.

agathos: good

Original Word: ἀγαθός, ἡ, ὄν

Definition: good

Usage: intrinsically good, good in nature, good whether it be seen to be so or not, the widest and most colorless of all words with this meaning.

Young women

sóphroneó: to be of sound mind, i.e. to be temperate

Original Word: σωφρονέω

Usage: I am of sound mind, am sober-minded, exercise self-control.
